MESSAGE FROM FR MICHAEL Today we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which draws the Christmas season to a close. The Baptism of Jesus marked the beginning of His public life and ministry and also affirmed the relationship between the Son and the Father: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" (Luke 3:22).
